## CHURCH FOCUSED OUTCOMES

The student will:

Successfully complete the theoretical component of the course in a timely manner, being present at all study days and 60% of tutorials and, if unable to meet deadlines or be present at Study Days, give as much prior notice as possible	All outcomes
Attend main Sunday services most weeks	A1, A2, A4
Preach once every 8 weeks in the 1st year and every 6 weeks in the 2nd year (and give as much prior notice as possible if unable to fulfil a commitment). The student will need to deliver an All-Age talk for the New Testament module at the end of Term 2 (usually early July) in <b>2024</b> and preach a sermon on an aspect of doctrine at the end of Term 1 (usually early April) in <b>2025</b>	A2, E1, E2, F2, G2
Help to lead / lead services regularly (at least once every 8 weeks in the 1 <sup>st</sup> year and once every 6 weeks in the 2 <sup>nd</sup> year and give as much prior notice as possible if unable to fulfil a commitment). The student will need to design and deliver a 25 minute service of the Word (which includes a creative prayer exercise in place of a sermon) to a group of people either on Zoom or in Church at the end of Term 2 (usually early July) <b>2025</b> . Attend and help to lead small groups throughout the year	A1, A2, A4, C3, F2
Help with baptism preparation and Confirmation courses and services once per year*	A2, C3, E1, F2
Undertake a six-week placement in a church tradition different from their own.**	B2
Engage in pastoral ministry in the church (everything from prayer ministry to accompanying others or doing pastoral visits counts here). The student will need to do an audit of the Pastoral Care being carried out in the church and make a presentation about it to the PCC or other leadership group at the end of Term 3 (usually late November/early December) <b>2025</b> .	C1, G2

Serve on church bodies or committees, including leadership groups (eg PCC, Staff meetings etc)	C2, C3, F2, F4, G2, G4
Work with the incumbent to foster the gifts/callings of others	C2
Work with others to design/lead worship and small groups in the church.	D2, F4
Be proactive in bringing ideas to the leader/leadership team(s), and listening to the ideas of others, helping the church to negotiate changes through the year	F4

The student will:

Help with mission/outreach events (eg alpha courses, MAP planning groups, coffee mornings, church fetes etc)	A1, C2, D3, G3

Look into how social media is used for mission by working with the person in church who is responsible for putting things on websites, Facebook, Instagram, Whatsapp etc.	A3, G3
Successfully complete the Mission & Evangelism and Reader Specialist modules of the course (including a visit to the Multi-Faith Centre at the University of Derby and a reflection on the visit). The student will need to give a presentation to the PCC or other leadership team for the Mission & Evangelism module at the end of Term 3 (usually late November/early December) <b>2024</b> . They will a need to preach a sermon on an aspect of Doctrine for the Reader Specialist module at the end of Term 2 (usually late March/early April) <b>2025</b> .	G3
